Remember that these monologues are essentially historical fiction, based on the Scripture but filling in plausible subjective details, both emotional responses and motivations. Your first task is to decide if they are reasonable.

Was Peter's failure, denying the Lord, likely an important part of his spiritual development?

What were some of the "rough edges" that needed to be addressed by the Lord?

Why do you think Jesus told the disciples to buy swords if He had no intention of fighting? (Luke 22:36)

Are Jesus' commands sometimes mystifying to us? Is that reason to disobey?

Why did Jesus appear first to a woman after His resurrection?

Why would Jesus not make stones into bread at the request of Satan? (Luke 4:3-4)

What was Jesus doing when he asked Peter, "Do you love me?"

How would you have felt if you were among the disciples at Pentecost?

How would you have felt if you were among the crowd at Pentecost?

How do we see Peter's personality preserved in an inspired message?

Without the lesson in humility, might Peter have become proud after the amazing response to repent?

Do we want to be involved in a revival?

What might the cost be?
