Miriam Discussion

Remember that these monologues are essentially historical fiction, based on the Scripture but filling in plausible subjective details, both emotional responses and motivations. Your first task is to decide if they are reasonable.

Miriam saw and participated in the miracle of Moses being rescued by the daughter of Pharaoh. Would that have made her aware that the LORD had something in mind for Moses?

Miriam became a worship leader. Does God seem at times to anoint families with interlocking ministries or do people just prefer working with their families?

When Aaron and Miriam both challenged Moses over his Gentile wife, why did only Miriam get afflicted with leprosy?

They all could have entered the Promised Land if the nation had trusted that the LORD could win the battles for them. What lesson is there for us?

Was it fair that the leaders and all the people be punished for the decision of the majority?

What are the challenges that Christians face today?

What is the basis of which we can we trust the LORD?

Is this world our Promised Land?

What miracles did the Israelites experience in the wilderness?

Did they notice?

Do we notice, acknowledge and give thanks for all the miracles of our daily existence?

What difference would that make if we did?

What does a "hopeless cause" mean to the LORD?

How do we activate the LORD's power?
