

Don Shockey has a B.A. in Anthropology and is a Doctor of Optometry. He has been to Mt. Ararat three times, worked at an ancient Roman site in Albania and has done extensive research on Indians in Mexico and SW U.S. In 1985 Dr. Shockey established the *Foundation for International Biblical Exploration and Research* to promote biblical archeological exploration. Dr. Shockey will present evidence on where Mt. Sinai is really located, not where your atlas places it. Come and find out why he believes the atlas is wrong.

Budgeted	Description
\$3000	6x18 foot covered utility trailer to carry all equipment and provide sleeping quarters once it is empty.
\$1000	Used 20x40 foot tent for shade and teaching area.
\$500	Dig tools, screens, latex, plaster, burlap.
\$600	110 volt gas generator.
\$250	GPS Global Positioning System for plotting dig areas.
\$500	Transit for dig site measurements and grid development.
\$200	8 2x8 foot fold down tables for bone prep, eating, games.
\$100	Poles and shade screens for dig site shade.
\$200	200-500 gallon plastic water tank for wash water from ranch wells.
\$200	Gasoline powered water pump for filling water tank, cleaning porta poti, and bones.
\$250	Used porta poti.
\$400	Solar powered shower, tank, and frame.
\$500	Computerized dig site record system cost of development. Data at site will be linked to a web site so people can log on to see our progress, make comments and ask questions.
\$200	Computer label printer for labeling all bones and containers with grid site info.
\$700	Digital camera for computer record system. Each artifact or bone will be entered into the computer record.
\$500	Vibro cleaner for cleaning bones.
\$200	Dremel tools for bone prep work.
\$500	Air compressor and "Air Scribe" tool for bone prep work.
\$600	2 low powered stereo microscopes for ant hill, microfossil, and microgeology work.
\$000	Used dental picks and forceps for bone prep.
\$10,400	Total budget to date.

We need someone to make plywood 12x16x18 inch field boxes to raise money for the ministry. These are used by students to store and organize collections of rocks, fossils, insects, stamps, coins or whatever. Person would be paid for their work.
