

Adventure Safaris Summer Activities

Are you Ready to Dig Into History? Many have shown interest in our dinosaur dig in the picturesque Badlands of North Dakota. We dug at a triceratops, hadrosaurus, and turtle site. Besides the dino skeletons, there were alligator, dromeosaurus, and sting ray teeth found. Last years dig was a great success and we wanted to let you know the dates for this summer's dig season.

We send you a 40 page workbook before the dig so you can practice dig techniques in your back yard. The dinosaur dig is an opportunity for the whole family to not only dig dinosaurs, but have good Christian fellowship and activities, too.

We are running five, 5 day camps again this summer July 6th - Aug. 7th. It will once again be at Willard Swanke's, Cedar Ridge Ranch, near Bowman, in the South West corner of North Dakota. Both electricity and water are available at the ranch camp site. The cost is \$700 per family, \$600 for individuals. This covers all tools and teaching materials, guide service, ranch rental, electricity and water. You provide your own tent or trailer, and food. Motels are available in Bowman 25 miles away.

A travel trailer is needed for the 5 weeks to house the dig director. If you have one available from July 6th through Aug. 7, please give Russ a call. You could receive a tax deduction, rent or a week at the dig in exchange for the use of the trailer.

Sponsors are needed to help children go on a dig. Only \$225 will give a child an unforgettable week on a real dinosaur dig.

May 2nd 10 AM - 3 PM, is our first dig of the season at Lilydale, along the river near downtown St. Paul. Cost is \$8 each or \$16 for the whole family. Call for more information on this or other activities this summer.
